

OUR YEAR WITH THE PANDEMIC

The first term of the 2019-2020 school year started out smoothly, but was soon interrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the nationwide 24-hour lockdown in April 2020 we arranged to distribute **220 breakfast boxes** to families in our breakfast programmes, including breakfast for five people for two weeks.

Over the summer we worked with other local charities to provide **food boxes to over 10,500 people**, distribute food vouchers and reusable masks and offered **525 hot meals to children**.

We also **purchased and distributed 100 tablets** with keyboards and covers to help students continue their education via online learning.





WHEN SCHOOLS REOPENED

We have expanded to the high schools in North and South Caicos and now reach 380 students every school day in our Breakfast Programme.

There is also a new primary school in Long Bay, which we reach through the Food Bank Programme. Our Breakfast Programme and Food Bank Programme now **reach 560 children** at all government schools in all of the Islands.




FUNDRAISING
